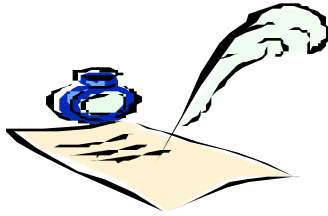

Retiree News

Dear Fellow Retiree:

I would like to share with you the status of two benefit programs that affect many of our retirees, spouses, surviving spouses and dependents. The first benefit program is COBRA, maintained by Kaiser. As of the end of 2006, there were a total of 304 retirees (including spouses and dependents) enrolled in that program. In the under age 65 category, there were 140 people enrolled and in the age 65 and over category, there were 124 people enrolled. In addition, 40 individuals have elected to receive custodial care and prescription drug benefits only. The COBRA enrollment is becoming smaller each year and, as a result, may cause more volatility in the premiums.

The second benefit program is the VEBA Plan. I am pleased to report that, based upon the efforts of the VEBA Trustees and KASRA, enrollment in the VEBA Plan increased significantly in the fourth quarter of last year. Special thanks are due to each of our members who helped to get the VEBA Plan's enrollment message out to retirees and surviving spouses who were not previously enrolled, and to each of our members who assisted them in completing enrollment and benefit reimbursement claim forms, where help was needed. VEBA Plan benefits are payable on a "Family Unit" basis. As of December 31, 2006, there were 4,362 Family Units eligible to participate in the VEBA Plan, and 3,533 (about 81%) of them were enrolled. Enrollment efforts will continue this year in an effort to provide retirees and their families the benefits to which they are entitled. We hope by the end of this year to make personal contact with retirees and surviving spouses in the remaining 829 Family Units to be sure that they are aware of the benefits that they are eligible to receive. **There is no reason not to enroll in the VEBA Plan, and I urge you to do so this year if you are eligible but have not already done so.**

As of December 31, 2006, \$3.3 million had been paid out in reimbursement of 2006 qualified benefit claims. Only individuals who were enrolled prior to December 31, 2006 are eligible for 2006 qualified benefits. However, qualified benefit claims for 2006 may be submitted by eligible individuals at any time prior to the December 31, 2007 deadline for submitting such claims. **Now is a very good time to review your records to be certain that you claim (or have claimed) all of the 2006 qualified benefits to which you are entitled.** The benefit amount for 2007 has not yet been determined.

The VEBA Trustees have selected the Capital Guardian Trust Company as the investment manager for a majority of the assets of the VEBA Trust and Plan. Capital Guardian Trust Company is a leading institutional investment money manager and one of the Capital Group Companies of Los Angeles. Capital Guardian Trust Company assumed investment management responsibility for \$74 million in VEBA Trust and Plan assets on February 1, 2007.

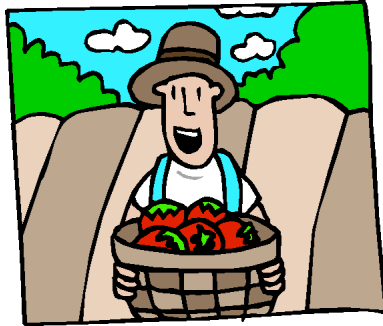

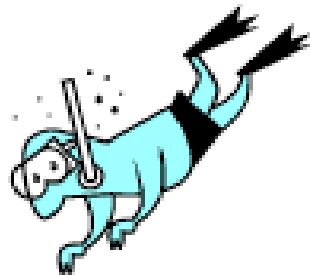

Happy Anniversary. Jane and **Bill Warfield** of Rancho Mirage, CA, will celebrate their 50th anniversary this June.

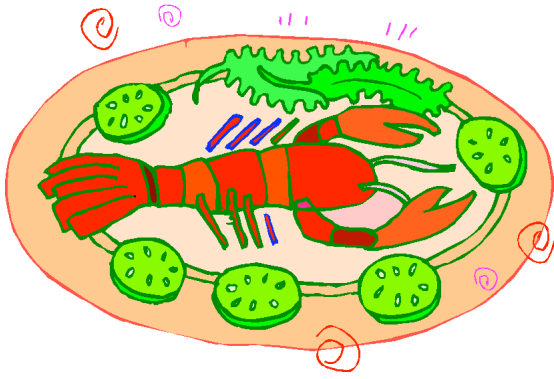
