

MEMBER PROFILE: Jim Sanderson


In 1970, **Jim Sanderson** was on his way to Parkersburg, WV for a job interview. Seeing the Ravenswood exit sign on I-77, Sanderson recalled former Kaiser Aluminum Ravenswood metallurgists **Roger Coleman** and **Dick Ash** whom he'd met earlier while working as a lab technician in Richmond, VA. They were pivotal in his decision to attend Virginia Tech and pursue a degree in metallurgy. With graduation on the horizon, Sanderson took the freeway exit for an unscheduled stop at the Ravenswood plant. It was a serendipitous move that would cause him to reject 13 other job offers and launch a 32-year career with Kaiser Aluminum. He began as a product engineer at Ravenswood, was promoted to senior hot rolling metallurgist, then served as a customer liaison with the auto parts and cookware industries. Sanderson moved to the Chicago sales office where he spent six years as regional field engineer, serving 7 states in the Midwest. From there, he became national stadium seating engineer at the Kaiser Extrusion plant in Dolton, IL.

In 1980, Sanderson moved to the Los Angeles Extrusion plant where he served as plant metallurgist and was promoted

to production superintendent before being named plant manager. In 1985, the corporation transferred him to manage the Sherman, TX, Extrusion plant for five years. He returned to CA in 1990 to resume managing the Los Angeles Extrusion plant until 1993. Sanderson then spent seven years as division technical manager in Dallas, TX, before becoming lean manufacturing manager in 2000, a move that brought him back to California to Laguna Niguel. In 2002, he retired with 32 years of service. Today, Sanderson remains a consultant, representing the existing corporation at meetings conducted by the Aluminum Association, Aluminum Extruders Council, ISO and ASTM, where he chairs the Light Metals and Alloys Committee. Sanderson lives with his wife, Karyn, in Huntington Beach.


Q. What are your hobbies?
