Jack Holtzapple (Lafayette, CA) and his wife haven't been spending much

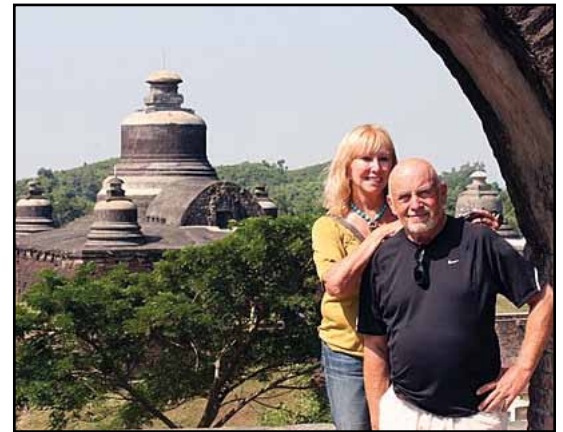

in Portland, but my dad said I should go to Trentwood, WA, first and talk to them. It was the first time my dad ever raised his voice to me. He was pretty determined that I work for Kaiser.

1. How did you get involved with Kaiser Aluminum?

My parents managed an apartment/hotel in Spokane, WA, where we also lived. The Alcoa Plant Managers, who were setting up the Trentwood, WA, plant stayed at the place, and we got to know them.

They asked my dad if he'd like to work for the war effort, and he said yes. He was a cowboy from Montana with a third-grade education, but he learned how to read blueprints and became a Hydraulic Specialist at Trentwood, WA.

I went on to Oregon State on a Navy scholarship, and following graduation as a business major, I served my three years in the Navy. When I got out, I started looking for a job and found one

2. It appears that the first job at Trentwood, WA, led you to jobs at Kaiser plants all around the country and Europe. Tell us about it.

To my dad's delight, I started off in 1955 at Trentwood, WA, as a Scrap Foreman and went on to be a Planner, then a Shift Foreman, Planning Scheduling Supervisor and, finally, General Foreman before transferring to Ravenswood, WV, as a Chief Planner. I was only 29 years old, and it was a little intimidating working with all these people who had much more experience.

Two years later, I was back in California opening a new Mobile Home Panel Division in Anaheim, CA, with such great teammates as Jesse Erickson, Nadine Egnor Blansett, and Sid Weber. I asked that Nadine be transferred with me from Ravenswood, WV. She was the first woman in Kaiser that I knew of to be transferred across the country. Bill Edmunds gave us \$99,000 and told us to lease everything, which we did. It was such a success that we started a second plant in Elkhart, IN.

In 1965, I had my biggest transfer yet. Kaiser sent me to Tokyo as a Technical Advisor to build the SKY aluminum rolling mill in Fukaya. It was a little

daunting working with all these Japanese engineers. I understood the business side, but I sweated out the technical side. Dave Fenton was the Marketing VP, and he was great.

After four years, I was transferred back to the states and worked as a Foil and Container Manager, with the can plants added subsequently – that made nine plants to visit. I went on to work at several plants and positions including the Manager of the Rod, Bar, and Wire Division, Forgings Division, and Sheet and Plate Division Manager. In 1980, I was sent to Düsseldorf, Germany to be Vice President of Manufacturing and Sales for Kaiser Aluminum Europe (KAE) with Manfred Knauer as a partner handling everything else expertly. It was a great job and our boss was nine time zones away! I was still on the KAE board when we moved to Portland, OR, where we negotiated with the Bonneville Power Administration for the power to run Kaiser's three Northwest plants. I finally retired in 1986 when KAE was sold.

3. How did your family fare with all this traveling?

Jan and I were already married when I first started working for Kaiser. We've now been married 58 years. She was a pharmacist and, luckily, really enjoyed traveling and was able to register as a pharmacist in four different states. But it was hard on her when we moved to Japan. I had to go ahead, leaving her in the states to sell the car and house, and get the kids through

4. Although you retired from Kaiser in 1986, you stayed in the field didn't you?

I was happily retired when a headhunter showed up and offered me a position as CEO of IMCO Recycling. They had a plant in Oklahoma and one under construction in Tennessee. With the help of three younger Alcoa teammates and six great KACC consultants, we grew to multiple plants in the United States and Europe. We became the world's largest aluminum can recycler. I stayed on until 1994 and then retired to serve on their board.

5. What are you doing now?

Jan and I are enjoying our lovely retirement community in Cupertino. There is so much to do here at The Forum. It's a very active place. We also enjoy traveling and, a few years ago, we went on safari in South Africa with a family we had
