MEMBER PROFILE: Gerry Carrell

Retiree Gerry Carrell began his career with Kaiser in the late 1960s and retired in 1988. He lives in Clovis, CA, with his wife Pat.

What was your history with Kaiser Aluminum?

I had the opportunity to move around a bit. I started working for Kaiser in the late 1960s in sales in the Building Products Division in Minneapolis, MN. In the early '70s, I was transferred to Baton Rouge, LA, where I worked at Gramercy as an administrative manager. The following year, I found myself in the Chemical Division in Oakland, CA. Five years later, I moved to Manager of Public Relations at Oakland when Dick Blake retired.

Tell us about some of the fun things you did in Public Relations.

This was such a great experience. I organized all kinds of sporting events and had the privilege of working with the customers and employees from the varied organizations within Kaiser. Some

of the events included Oakland A's and San Francisco Giants baseball games, including the All Star Games. We also put together groups for Oakland Raider and San Francisco 49er football games and even Superbowl events. I was also fortunate to work on several Indy 500 events and golf tournaments around the Bay Area. I have so many funny stories about the events and all the wonderful folks I worked with. Our motto within the Kaiser Family was "Find a Need and Fill It." We did that and more!

A few of Gerry's colleagues had this to say about working with him.

"Gerry is one of my favorite people -- a true Kaiser original," says Howard Nelson (Alamo, CA). "He was the ultimate go-to guy when you really needed something. Some years ago, when the late Reed Edwards and I oversaw the retirees' Sour Mash Open golf tournament, we were in a panic after our usual course backed out of its commitment to us at the last minute. We personally visited every public golf course in the Bay Area but could find no home for the event. We called Gerry, and within minutes, he had us booked into Franklin Canyon in Hercules, CA, where everyone in the Pro shop owed Gerry a favor for something he had done for them over the years! Gerry's network of friends in the Bay Area's sports scene included Tony La Russa and virtually the entire A's management."

Howard added that he and Gerry developed a relationship outside of Kaiser as well. "Gerry and I played golf together at Franklin Canyon at sunrise on most Saturday mornings for about 20 years," he recalls. "Gerry was a good golfer and

Joanne Gutierrez (Pleasant Hill, CA) adds, "Gerry always had a smile on his face. I had the opportunity to work with him and Steve Hutchcraft on Kaiser's Oakland A's events. We would select someone to throw out the first pitch, organize and distribute tickets to employees and


